

The 2021 Biomedical Career Advancement Program

Why BCAP?

The Biomedical Career Advancement Program (BCAP) is a summer research experience for youth interested in pursuing careers in heath science. BCAP is an amazing opportunity to explore STEM careers. Students will work alongside senior research/clinical faculty to explore research investigation in a highly enriched environment.

Program Structure and Activities

Students will be expected to conduct research under the direction and support of a faculty mentor. BCAP-hosted didactic days will include the following activities:

- Certified training: Students will receive training to conduct research at Wayne State University and serve as volunteers at the Detroit Medical Center
- Advanced-level laboratory experiments: Students will learn to apply common laboratory techniques to understand human disease (polymerase chain reaction (PCR), gel electrophoresis, microscopy, pipetting, etc.)
- Career Panels: Students will engage in open, honest dialogues with health-science students and professionals to gain first-hand information and practical advice on various career paths.
- Professional development: Students will participate in activities to develop their writing and presentation skills.
- Networking: Students will meet like-minded individuals that are on the same career path and will be mentored by university faculty and graduate students.

Selection Criteria

- High school students grades 10-12 (Wayne county residents will be given priority).
- Personal statement: Interest in pursuing health science career
- Cumulative GPA ≥ 3.0 (transcripts will be required upon program acceptance)

Timeline

- Application Open Date: January 4, 2021
- Application Close Date: February 15, 2021 by 5 p.m.
- Student Supply Pickup (in person): TBD
- Student Orientation (mandatory): June 19, 2021
- Opening Ceremony (mandatory): June 25, 2021
- Program Start Date: June 28, 2021
- Closing Ceremony (mandatory): August 6, 2021

Monetary Award

Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to receive a monetary award of \$1,250.

Program Requirements

Students are required to present their research at the closing day ceremony and complete weekly assigned program evaluations. Certificates will be awarded to each student completing the program.

Application Deadline

Applications must be received by February 15, 2020 by 5 p.m. Please complete your online application at https://miahec.wayne.edu/southeast/highschool Student acceptance will be communicated by email.
