WHAT IS MICHIGAN AHEC?

Through a statewide network of regional centers, MI-AHEC prepares underrepresented and disadvantaged youth for health care careers, promotes clinical training opportunities for students in rural and urban medically underserved shortage areas and provides continuing education programs for health professionals.

HOW IS MICHIGAN AHEC FUNDED?

Michigan AHEC is funded by the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA), Wayne State University and local funds.

HOW LONG HAS MICHIGAN AHEC BEEN IN MICHIGAN?

Michigan AHEC was formed in 2010 with the Southeast Regional Center and has since grown to five regional centers covering all 83 counties in Michigan.

WHAT IS THE AHEC SCHOLARS PROGRAM?

Michigan AHEC Scholars Program is part of a national initiative to prepare tomorrow's health professionals to become leaders in interprofessional, transformative practice who serve those who need it the most. It is designed for health professions students interested in supplementing their education.

We offer many programs throughout the state that expose high school students from underrepresented rural and urban areas to health professions careers.

We also offer community-based student education and clinical training for health professions students.
