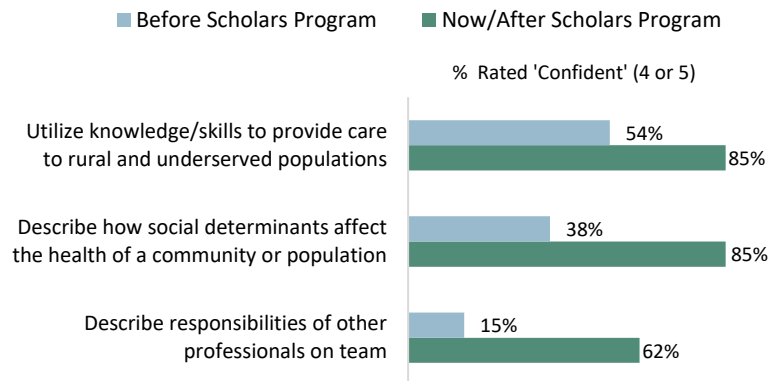

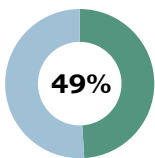

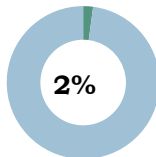


Pipeline programs expose students to health careers and develop intent to pursue post-secondary education in primary healthcare professions.

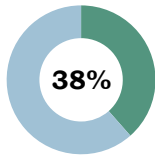

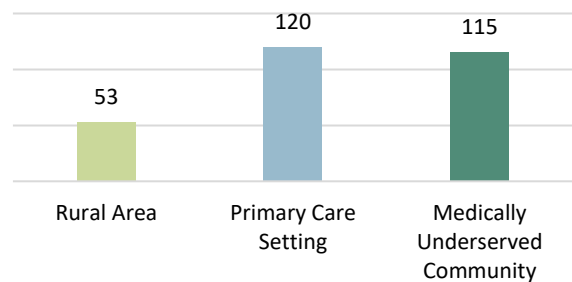

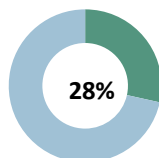

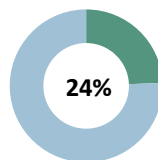

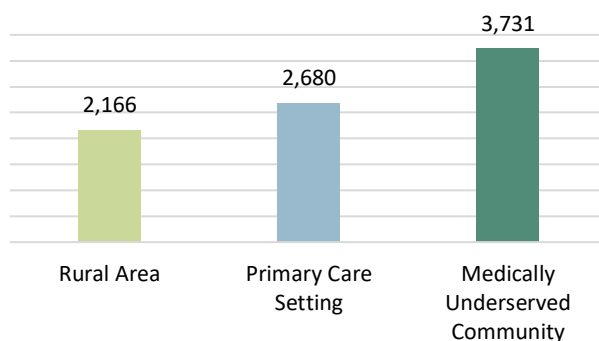
