Dr. Zeina Habib is an Assistant Professor of Internal Medicine at Central Michigan University College of Medicine and Medical Education Partners. She received her Medical Doctor degree from the American University of Beirut in Lebanon. She completed her Internal Medicine residency at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, MI, and an Endocrinology, Diabetes and Metabolism fellowship at Loyola University Medical Center in Maywood, IL. She currently practices in Saginaw, MI as an endocrinologist, and provides medical care for patients with diabetes and other endocrine disorders.



Dr. Marcia Mastracci Ditmyer

Dr. Marcia Mastracci Ditmyer is Dean for the Crystal M. Lange College for Health and Human Services at Saginaw Valley University (SVSU) in Saginaw, Michigan. She came to SVSU after serving as the associate dean for education and professor in residence with Emerita at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV), School of Dental Medicine where she provided leadership and assumed oversight for all educational programs and learning environments within the school. In her 18 years at UNLV, she gained experience in interprofessional education and collaborative practice working within a variety of health professions.



Dr. Joseph Inungu

Joseph Inungu is a professor of global health in the School of Health Sciences at Central Michigan University (CMU). He is the founding Director of the Master of Public Health Program at CMU. Before joining CMU, he served as the Director of socio-behavioral research for the International AIDS Vaccine Initiative (IAVI) in Southern Africa. IAVI is a New York-based non-governmental organization specializing in HIV vaccine research. Prior to joining IAVI, he worked as the Regional Researcher for Population Services International (PSI) in West and Central Africa.



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
